

Passengers on all regional and international flights may take in their hand luggage through the security check-in, no liquids other than a maximum of 10 x 100ml bottles of liquids, aerosols and gels (LAGs), contained in a transparent plastic bag with a one-litre maximum capacity. LAGs include drinks, soup, syrups, creams, lotions, oils, perfumes, mascara, sprays, gels, contents of pressurised containers (deodorants and shaving foams), pastes (including toothpaste), liquid/solid mixtures and other items of similar consistency."*

**09h05** - On arrival at OR Tambo International Airport off British Airways flight **BA057**, a representative will meet you, hand over further documentation and assist you to your hotel.

The Apartheid Museum, the first of its kind, illustrates the rise and fall of apartheid. The exhibits are from film footages, photographs, text panels and artifacts illustrating the events and human stories that are part of the epic saga, known as apartheid. A series of 22 individual exhibition areas takes the visitor through a dramatic emotional journey that tells a story of a state sanctioned system based solely on racial discrimination. Return to the hotel later this afternoon.

**10h30** – Depart Johannesburg on South African Airways flight **SA62** to Lusaka.

***The World Health Organisation (WHO) has revised the Yellow Fever vaccination recommendations for Africa. The South African Department of Health has subsequently issued a statement that all travellers from South Africa to Zambia and travellers from Zambia to South Africa will now require proof of yellow fever vaccination. Previously, this was not required.***

**All in-transit passengers between the two destinations, irrespective of the time period in transit, will also require proof of yellow fever vaccination.**

*As you will be entering Zambia, a single entry visa will be required and is obtainable at the point of entry at a cost of USD50.00 per person, payable in cash. The visa fee is subject to change at the discretion of the Zambian Government.*

#### **Zambian Visas Reminder**

*Clients traveling to Zambia are advised to please check that the visa is stamped into their passports before moving on from the immigration desk upon arrival. Clients should also double-check that they have been allocated the correct number of days for the duration of their visit or risk a fine which can amount to USD 250.00 per day that they overstayed.*

**12h35** - On arrival at the Lusaka International Airport, clear customs and immigrations and collect your luggage. Make your way through the Arrivals Terminal where you will be met and assisted onto your private charter flight to Puku Ridge.

Depart Lusaka on a Proflight private charter flight to Mfuwe.

On arrival at the Mfuwe Airport a camp representative will meet and transfer you to the lodge. The transfer time is approximately 1 hour and 30 minutes.

The Puku Ridge Camp situated in a remote wildlife-rich area in the South Luangwa National Park. It's named after the elusive Puku antelope that inhabits the Kakumbi floodplain, which the camp overlooks

The main lounge, dining and relaxation areas have been refreshingly styled in a non-traditional African theme, with contemporary furnishings. The deck overlooks the Luangwa riverbed and small waterhole making it the perfect place to sit and watch the African bush unfold.

The Camp offers a full range of day and night game drives in the South Luangwa National Park, using open 4X4 vehicles driven by knowledgeable guides. The emphasis in this area is on the wonderful opportunities for walking safaris with a professional guide and an armed scout.

Please meet the representative in the reception area of the hotel from where you depart on a morning tour of Cape Town City.

We drive through the Cape Town suburb of Tamboerskloof ("Drummers' Ravine") to the lower cable car station on the slopes of Table Mountain. Weather permitting we make the short and comfortable ascent to the top of the mountain by cable car. The panoramic view of the sea and city from the summit is magnificent.

Then we begin our tour of historic Cape Town. After the excitement of "summitting" Table Mountain we take an easy walk through the tranquil Company Gardens (the remnants of the Dutch East India Company's fruit and vegetable gardens) with notable important buildings including the Houses of Parliament, the Tuynhuis ("Townhouse" or Cape Town's "White House"), National Art Gallery and National Library. From here we make our way to the Castle of Good Hope. Built between 1666 and 1679 by the Dutch East India Company, this pentagonal fortification replaced a small clay and timber fort, built in 1652 by Commander Jan van Riebeeck, founder of the maritime replenishment station at the Cape of Good Hope. The Castle Military Museum depicts the military history of the Cape, the Castle and Cape Regiments. Also worth a visit is the William Fehr collection consisting of artwork reflecting many aspects of cultural life at the Cape from the early VOC days until the middle of the 19th century. End your tour visiting the notorious dungeon. As a result of rising damp, the dungeon was not fit to store gun powder as intended and was later used as a prison for the accused awaiting trial.

Your tour will end at the hotel or at the bustling Victoria & Alfred Waterfront, built around the old harbour. A hugely popular destination with tourists and locals alike (80% of visitors are from Cape Town itself) the Waterfront is unique in terms of being a working harbour while still boasting a varied selection of eclectic shops, restaurants and tourist attractions from scenic helicopter rides to boat cruises.

Please meet the representative in the reception area of the hotel and depart on a full day tour to Cape Point.

Hugging the Atlantic coast road we journey past the "bikini beaches" of Clifton and Camps Bay, beautifully located at the base of the towering Twelve Apostles Mountains. We travel over the Suikerbossie ("Sugar Bush") Pass and descend into the bucolic Hout Bay valley, with its bustling fishing harbor and white sand beach.

From here we travel over the famous Chapman's Peak Drive (subject to road conditions) to join the sea again at the town of Noordhoek. This historic road, high on the mountainside overlooking the sea, was once considered "impossible to build", but Charl Marais (mining surveyor) rose to the challenge and made it happen at an estimated cost of £20 000 using 700 convict labourers.

Our journey continues to the Cape of Good Hope Nature Reserve at the end of the Cape Peninsula. The reserve, which covers 22000 acres of land, converges in the south at Cape Point, a great pinnacle of rock.

You can climb the steps or ride a funicular railway - the "Flying Dutchman" - to the top from where you may see southern right whales in spring and early summer, dolphins and a variety of seabirds. The original lighthouse at Cape Point was built in 1860. The present lighthouse, one of the most powerful in the southern hemisphere, is closer to the point itself than the original.

We travel back through the reserve looking out for some of the animals that live here, including the rare Bontebok, Eland and Cape Mountain Zebra.

En route to lunch we visit Boulders, a lovely beach sheltered from the wind and famous for its colony of endangered Jackass Penguins on the coast of False Bay near Simon's Town. Boulders, had just two breeding pairs in 1982 but thanks to careful management the population has grown to about 3000 in recent years. This is a rare and rewarding experience.

Pass through Simon's Town, which was the Royal Navy's main base in the south Atlantic from 1815 until 1957 and has the feel of a small English seaside village with steep narrow streets and cobbled alleyways. You will learn about the famous hound called "Just Nuisance", the most renowned animal in the annals of the Royal Navy.

Lunch will be enjoyed en route.

Travel back towards Cape Town passing through the attractive, up-market suburb of Constantia, the cradle of the South African wine industry boasting famous estates like Klein Constantia. At Kirstenbosch the world-renowned National Botanical Garden, recently voted one of the Top Ten gardens in the World by the curators of Kew Gardens in London, a private, local guide ensures that you learn about some of the more fascinating aspects of the gardens and get as much as possible out of the visit. We return to the hotel passing interesting sites such as the University of Cape Town, Rhodes Memorial and Mostert's Mill, a Dutch windmill dating back to 1797.

Please meet the representative in the reception area of the hotel and depart on your full day tour of the Cape Winelands

Leave Cape Town this morning and head towards the famous Cape Winelands set below the dramatic range of mountains known as the "Hottentots Holland". Whitewashed homesteads nestling under avenues of oaks, rolling green hills covered with wild flowers, fertile valleys alive with the sounds of surging streams, restaurants with French names and Dutch flavours... such is the setting of the Winelands, home of some of the world's finest wines and Stellenbosch, the second oldest town in South Africa after Cape Town.

In Stellenbosch, our famous university town, founded in 1679, by Governor Simon van der Stel, you will have the chance to explore the town with a specialised guide, whose local knowledge is intimate. Walk through the town, hearing about its historic significance and renowned contemporary wine industry. You will see areas of great architectural heritage including examples of Cape Dutch, Georgian and Victorian properties, often set amongst rows of beautiful oak trees. Your walk finishes at the fascinating Village Museum, which chronicles the town's past and incorporates the oldest existing house, which dates back to 1709. Stellenbosch is also the centre of the local wine industry.

After visiting the town we visit a privately owned winery, the picturesque Rustenberg Estate, owned by the Barlow family for generations and renowned for its award winning wines, attractive location and famous herd of Jersey cows. We then journey up over a breath-taking mountain pass called the Hels Hoogte ("Precipitous Heights") Pass and down into the Banghoek Valley, en-route to Franschhoek.

We have a special lunch planned this afternoon.

Then we head for our final winetasting and cellar tour of the day at the beautiful Plaisir de Merle estate near the village of Simondium. Blessed through the ages by the hands of many excellent winemaking families, the Plaisir de Merle story carries a proud legacy of exceptional people who have created an unsurpassed viticultural and vinicultural tradition. The new cellar was opened on 1st December 1993 to commemorate the signing of the original land grant by Simon van der Stel 300 years before to the day.

We then travel across country to the historic town of Paarl ("Pearl") passing the Victor Verster Prison from where former President Nelson Mandela was released in 1990. Surrounded by fruit and wine farms Paarl nestles in the Berg River Valley beneath the imposing granite rocks of Paarl Mountain. We will drive up a mountain road to visit the unique Taal Monument, the only monument ever built to immortalise a language (the Afrikaans language). Standing proudly on top of Paarl Mountain the vistas over town, vineyards and mountains are magnificent.

Continue onto Franschhoek Country House & Villas.

This exclusive boutique hotel - a restored manor house and former perfumery, dating back to 1890, is situated on the outskirts of the Franschhoek village in the Cape Winelands.

Flanked by the majestic Huguenot Mountains, the Franschhoek Country House is about an hour's drive from Cape Town.

The original Franschhoek Country House offers twelve luxury villas, six standard de luxe rooms, five luxury rooms and two garden cottages. Almost all the rooms lead out onto private balconies or patios, with magnificent views.

The famous Monneaux restaurant is known for its innovative, modern French cuisine. A la carte lunches are served in the tranquil gardens while dinner is served in the elegant dining room or enclosed veranda.

We have a group reservation at 7pm.

Guests can unwind in the clubroom, do a few lengths in the swimming pool or enjoy a little pampering at the in-house salon.
